

Eloïsa is not from here She arrived one day with her father




A little here

What are you saying?

I don't want to go

What are these strange creatures?

I'm scared Why do I have to go to school?

The show tells, in a quirky way, the story of a day in the life of this unusual duo: a father and daughter.

Why these two? Each member of the audience is drawn into their relationship and, as the story unfolds, invents their own narrative.

The world around them is seen through Eloïsa's impressions: a distorting, poetic gaze, sometimes playful, sometimes colorful, and at times unsettling.

This particular day is Eloïsa's first day of school: a significant experience that everyone can relate to. And on top of that, Eloïsa is discovering a new country with a whole new set of cultural norms.



A composite form

To tell this story, we chose to explore narration through movement rather than words.

We focused on the bodies, on the interaction between characters and with the space.



The set is brought to life through projections and becomes a reflection of the world surrounding the characters.

From an aesthetic point of view, we worked with various images created from drawings and collages.

An original musical composition accompanies the performance and energizes the scenes.

Under the awed gaze of the little girl, characters appear: they all have frog faces.

The universe is quirky and unexpected, drawing the audience into a playful and poetic world.



Eloïsa is a story about the adventure shared between a father and his daughter, bound by a unique connection in a moment of disorientation.

Eloïsa shows us that it is possible to embrace the new, transform fears into curiosity, and find a sense of balance—while keeping alive the memory of what we have left behind.

It is a fable that gently and humorously explores the feeling of being "different", inviting the audience to see the world in a new way and to welcome change as an opportunity.



Eloïsa is loosely inspired by the children's book Eloïsa y los Bichos by Colombian author Jairo Buitrago
